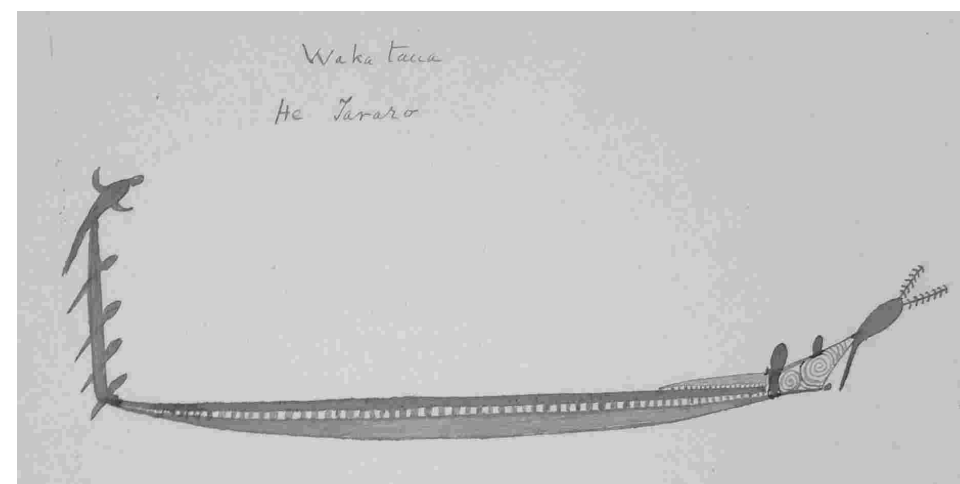

The image of a waka *en passage* across the sea is a metaphor for an individuals’ life journey through time. As the waka traverses the ocean the wake generated by the canoe in motion symbolizes the pursuit of knowledge. Sea spray thrown up by the prow of the canoe soars above. Illuminated by the suns rays, a rainbow appears, the individual is ready, knowledge becomes wisdom and life’s journey is rewarded.

He tirohanga ki muri ~ A view of the past is an attempt to capture and convey a selection of Māori heritage materials from the Hocken Library, which not only speak of important events and relationships, but also acknowledge the mana, (prestige, dignity and authority) of our ancestors through the words and wisdom they have left behind. They provide us with glimpses into our rich heritage and are a remarkable record of our ancestors’ opinions, lives and feelings.

It is hoped that by bringing together these taonga we add further depth and understanding to our journey in the pursuit of knowledge.
