


## Search for your topic

# Locate journal articles

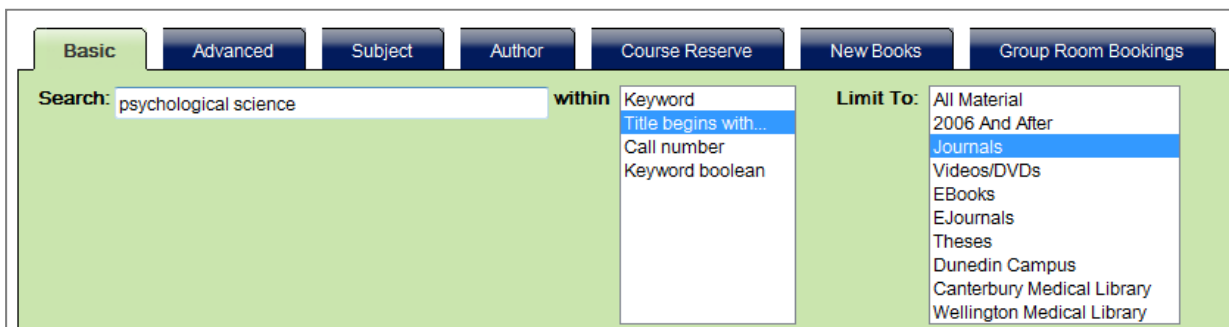
- **Journal\*** titles held by the Library are listed in the Library Catalogue.
- **Journal articles** are not listed in the Catalogue, unless they are part of E-Reserve. Use a database or print index to identify articles on a subject.

1. Use the **Article Linker** icon  on the database search result screen – it may lead to fulltext available elsewhere, OR....
2. Use the Library Catalogue to check if the Library has the journal title and volume number cited.

\* Journals are also called periodicals, magazines or serials. Popular, non-academic journals are often called magazines. Their articles are frequently unsigned, have no list of cited references and are not peer reviewed.
