Award for university library

The University of Otago's Information Services Building in Albany St links campus life with the rest of Dunedin, according to the Otago Chamber of Commerce.

Chamber president Iain Lindsay presented acting vice-chancellor Dr Phil Meade with the fourth City Development Award this week.

The award acknowledges a development which adds value to life in Dunedin.

"The Information Services Building is one such development . . . Not only is it technically amazing, its presence on the university campus adds economic value to the students' experiences," Mr Lindsay said.

Developments of the Dunedin Railway Station, Moana Pool and Otago Museum have also received the award.

The \$46.5 million Information Services Building, completed in 2001, contains the university's 2000-seat library, and social and study areas.
