Otago-Southland successes

Awards for five projects

Five projects in Otago and Southland won silver awards from the Association of Consulting Engineers NZ in Christchurch last night.

The Information Services Building at the University of Otago won an Innovate NZ 2003 award for architectural services for Opus International Consultants Ltd.

In Gore, consultant MWH New Zealand Ltd collaborated with the Gore District Council and Ice Sports Southland on the Multisports Centre, and was awarded a special mention for community effort.

The consultancy was also noted for excellence in civil engineering design in realigning the approach road from Frankton to Queenstown. Opus won an award for its advice to Transit in removing loose rock at Nevis Bluff.

The second tailrace tunnel for Meridian's Manapouri Power Station won a silver award for URS New Zealand Ltd.

A total of three golds, nine silver awards and five awards of merit were made.
